



Practical Tips - What do I need?

Top tips from the Countryside Code

- Get to know the signs and symbols used in the countryside
- Respect the needs of local people
- Visitors are allowed to access land in different ways - know your rights
- Give wild and farm animals space - protect plants and animals and take your litter home
- Crossing fields - leave gates and property as you find them

Wear covered sleeves and trousers or shorts for sun and vegetation protection. Sturdy boots are best but trainers and other walking shoes will be fine on this even levelled path.

- The walk can take from 40 to 70 minutes depending on how long you take to read the information boards and look at, or photograph features mentioned
- This is NOT a bike trail but a footpath for walkers
- Dogs must be kept under close control at all times
- Rubbish bins are located in the Northcroft car park, at Board 9 before you cross the Monkey Bridge, and between Boards 9 and 10 at the end of your walk
- The walk is suitable for wheelchair access but assistance may be needed in some places
- Be aware of seasonal variation to path and water levels
