WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL (B4009 LONG LANE/SHAW HILL, SHAW-CUM-DONNINGTON, COLD ASH, CHIEVELEY & NEWBURY) (30 M.P.H & 50 M.P.H SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 202*

WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL PROPOSES to make an Order under Sections 84(1) and (2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to impose a 30mph and 50mph speed limit as follows:

SCHEDULE 1 - 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT

B4009 Long Lane/ Shaw Hill	Between a point approx. 50m north of its junction with Love Lane
	and a point approx. 147m north of its junction with Highwood Close

SCHEDULE 2 – 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT

B4009 Long Lane	Between a point approx. 147m north of its junction with Highwood C	
	to a point approx. 295m south of its junction with Shaw Footpath 19	
B4009 Long Lane	Between a point approx. 637m south of its junction with Fishers Lane	
	and a point approx. 717m north of its junction with Fishers Lane	

No statutory provision imposing a speed limit on motor vehicles shall apply to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.

No speed limit imposed by this Order shall apply to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

Article 4 of WEST BERKSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, CHIEVELEY, COLD ASH, HERMITAGE AND SHAW-CUM-DONNINGTON) (30 MPH, 40 MPH AND 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2010 would be revoked.
