#### **Exams**

For some families, you will be heading out of summer with your focus on making plans for your child to sit exams next summer. If you have not already sourced an exam centre or venue now is the time to start looking around.

We can offer information and signpost to Exam Centre's, so please do get in touch if you are unsure where to start. Speaking of exams, you will certainly all be aware that GCSEs are the most common type of exam sat by young people, typically aged 14/16yrs.

There are several exam boards in the UK offering GCSE qualifications. The most common ones are AQA, OCR, and Edexcel.

There are alternative options to GCSE's with IGCSE's being one of them. In general IGCSE's do not have the coursework element or requirement for practical elements and this can make IGCSE's an appealing option.
